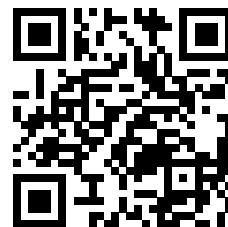


## Perfect Squares

Place a digit from 1 to 9 into each of the empty squares so that each digit appears exactly once in each of the rows, columns and the nine outlined 3x3 regions.

A dot between two cells indicates that the digits in the two cells form a double digit square number in the reading direction. there are no square numbers marked by a dot.
